DISCUSSION OF CALENDAR ITEMS

Calendar Item No. 4. – Resolution No. 6233-17-Linden Center Complex

Commissioner Williams asked for clarification of this calendar item.

Ms. Dickstein said this is a first step in removing the Linden Center Complex from the Public Commons Master Plan in order to redevelop the property for other use.

Mr. Aaron Sorrell, Director of Planning and Community Development, said the endeavor started in 2011 when the Department of Central Services was directed to seek proposals for the reuse of 14 properties. Mr. Sorrell said he was approached in 2012 by Gem City-Hilltop Community Development & Housing, Inc, (GCHCC) who are long time Daytonians and very familiar with

the Linden Center, regarding reuse of the property. He said he has worked with GCHCC on reuse possibilities, however, the uses are limited by the design. He said the GCHCC placed the Linden Center Complex on the national register of historical buildings and the City entered into a Memo of Understanding (MOU) giving them exclusive rights to the predevelopment of the Complex. Mr. Sorrell said in July 2016 GCHCC delivered all requirements that the City of Dayton had.

Commissioner Williams asked about any deed restrictions.

Mr. Sorrell said there were no deed restrictions on the property.

Commissioner Williams asked of the 14 properties how many have been reused.

Mr. Sorrell said seven properties have been reused.

APPROVAL OF CITY MANAGER'S RECOMMENDATIONS

Commissioner Shaw made the motion to approve the City Manager's Reports. Commissioner Joseph seconded the motion. The City Manager's Reports were approved with a 5-0 vote. Voting in the affirmative were Mayor Whaley, Commissioners Williams, Joseph, Mims and Shaw.
