The Do's and Do Not's When a Crime Happens

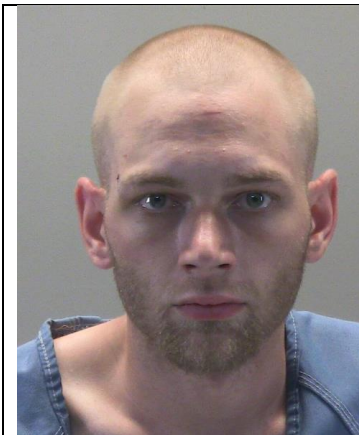
Do:

- Report crimes or possible crimes to the police.
 - If it is an emergency, call 911.
 - Otherwise, call 937-333-2677.
 - A report can be done online as well as by going to daytonpolicereports.com/apps/citizenreporting/
- Look through video footage if you have a camera. Detectives need all the information about when the crime occurred and if there is any suspect information.

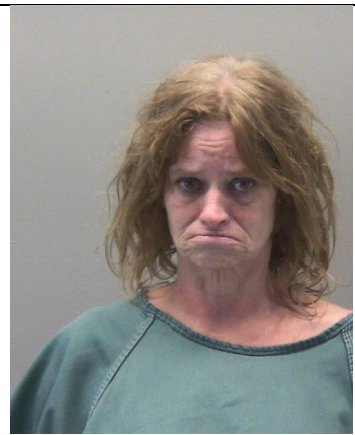
Don't:

- Report crimes on social media or social pages such as Facebook, Nextdoor, Ring Neighbors, etc.
- Report incidents at neighborhood meetings (unless an officer is present, a report cannot be taken from a third party.)
- Wait to report a crime. Report it immediately after it has been discovered.

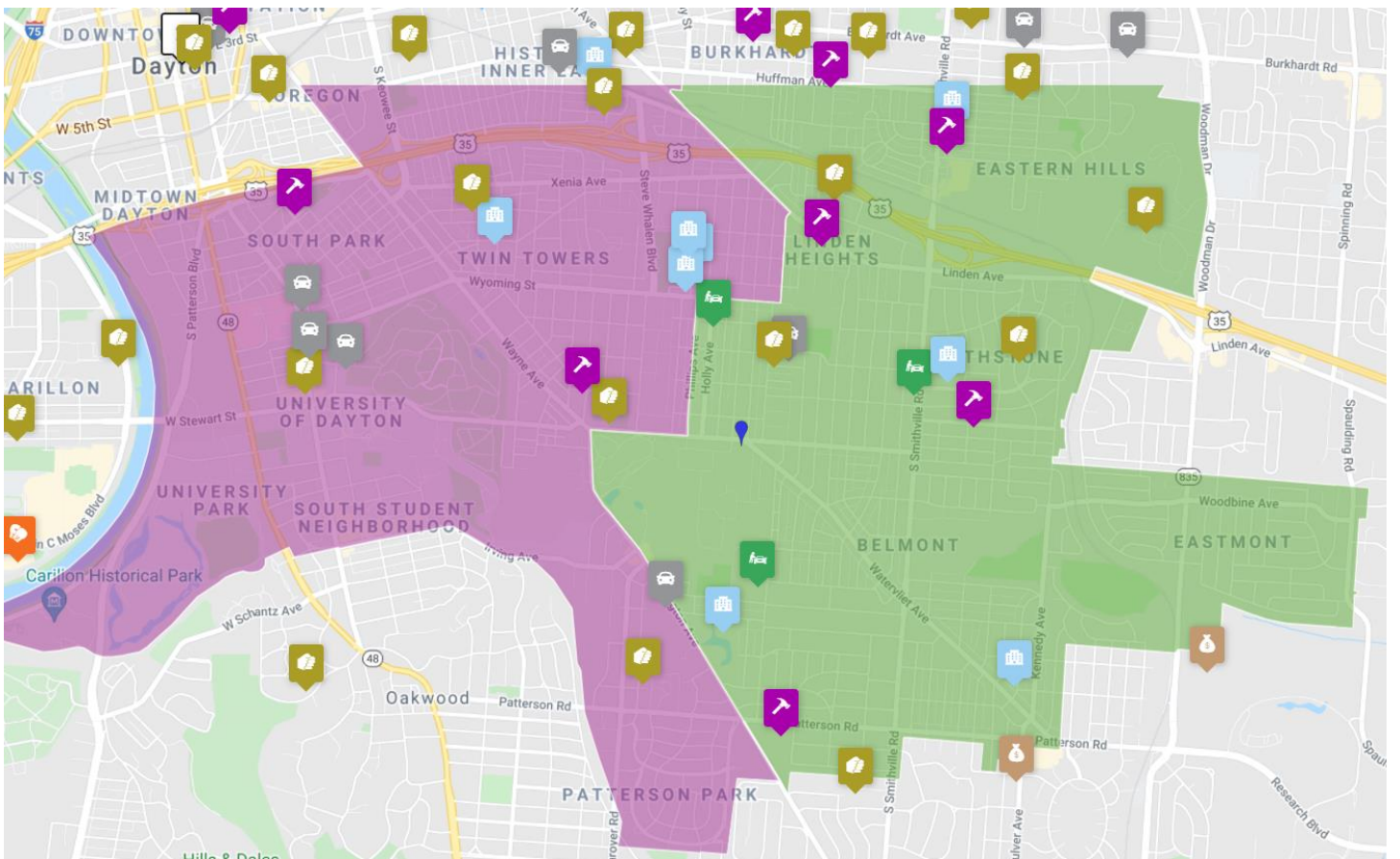
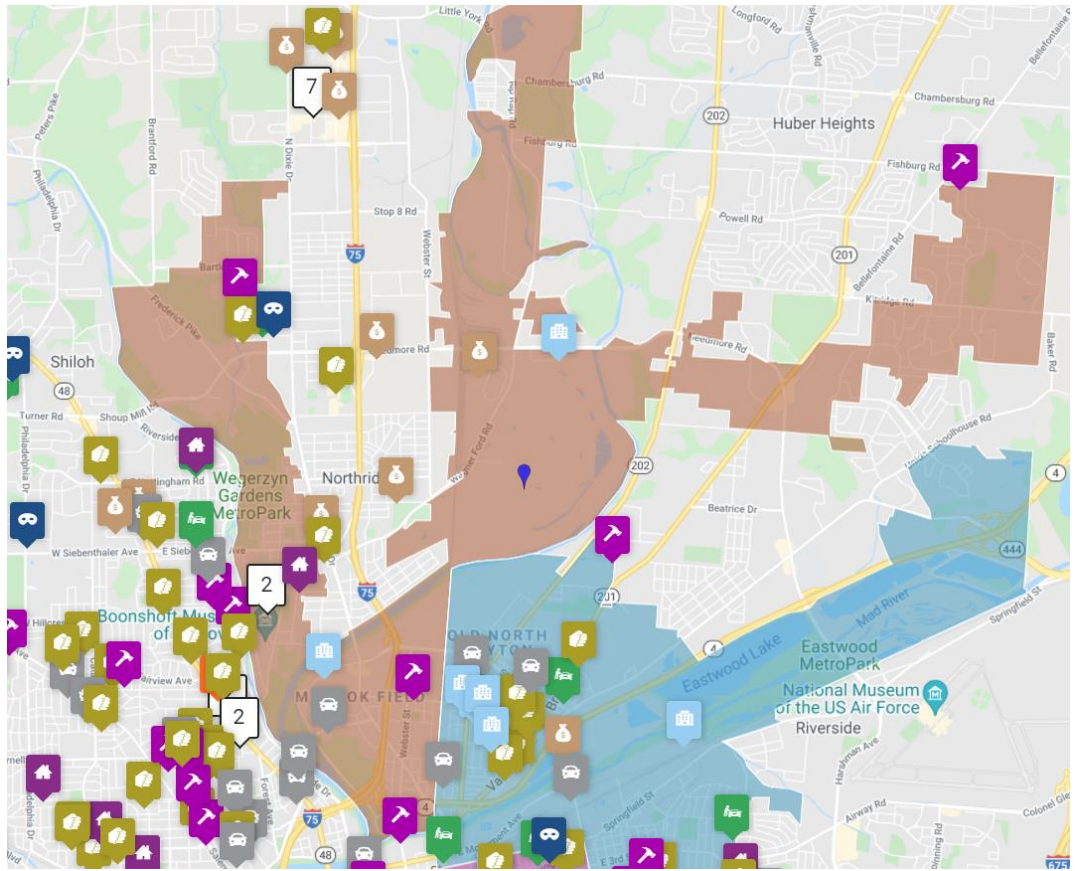

Catalytic converter theft

is on the rise in your neighborhood

An exhaust admission control device that reduces toxic gases and pollutants in exhaust gas

Contains valuable metals such as platinum

SUV's, because of their height, (easier to get to converter) and lighter weight cars, such as the Prius, (easier to jack up, if needed) are common targets, but all types of vehicles are prone to this theft. It only takes about 5 minutes to steal your converter.



What can you do to prevent Catalytic converter thefts?

- Park your car in your garage whenever possible
- Park in a well-lit area
- Set your car alarm to pick up vibrations
- Use motion sensor lights in your driveway





Fraud Alert

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE FRAUD ALERT

This is a Fraud Alert from the Office of Inspector General at the U.S. Department of Labor.

Fraudsters are perpetrating numerous schemes related to the COVID-19 pandemic. In one scheme, scammers have offered to help individuals file claims for unemployment benefits. The scammers then ask for personal information including social security numbers and dates of birth. The scammers may ask you to provide payment, or your credit card information, in assisting you in filing or qualifying for your unemployment benefits. You do not need to pay anyone to file or qualify for your benefits.

Unsolicited calls, social media platforms, and door-to-door visits are several ways that individuals have been targeted.

Be aware that your personal information may be used fraudulently without your permission.

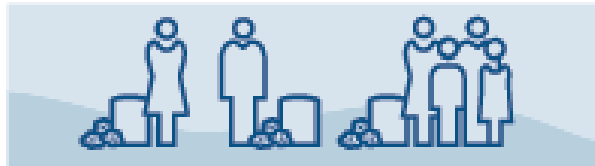
Victims of these scams face potential harm. The personal information the scammers collect may be used to commit identity theft to file fraudulent unemployment insurance claims.

Coronavirus (COVID-19) Funeral Assistance

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought overwhelming grief to many families. At FEMA, our mission is to help people before, during and after disasters. We are dedicated to helping ease some of the financial stress and burden caused by the virus.

FEMA is providing financial assistance for COVID-19-related funeral expenses incurred after January 20, 2020.



To be eligible for funeral assistance, you must meet these conditions:

- The death must have occurred in the United States, including the U.S. territories, and the District of Columbia.
- The death certificate must indicate the death was attributed to or caused by COVID-19.
- The applicant must be a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national or qualified alien who incurred funeral expenses after January 20, 2020.
- There is no requirement for the deceased person to have been a U.S. citizen, non-citizen national or qualified alien.

Which expenses will qualify for reimbursement?

Examples of eligible expenses for funeral services and interment or cremation may include, but not limited to:

- Transportation for up to two people to identify the deceased individual
- The transfer of remains, a casket or urn
- A burial plot or cremation niche
- A marker or headstone
- Clergy or officiant services
- The arrangement of a funeral ceremony
- The use of funeral home equipment or staff
- Cremation or interment costs
- Costs associated with producing multiple death certificates

What information do I need to provide to FEMA?

Please have the following information before contacting FEMA to apply:

- Your name, social security number, date of birth, mailing address and contact phone numbers.
- The name, social security number and date of birth for each deceased individual.
- The location or address where the deceased individual passed away.
- Documentation and receipts for any assistance already received from other sources, including burial or funeral insurance, donations, voluntary agencies, other government programs or non-profit organizations.
- If you and another person both incurred funeral expenses for the same deceased individual(s), you can also provide that person as a co-applicant – include their name, social security number and date of birth on the application.

HOW DO I APPLY FOR THIS ASSISTANCE?

Call FEMA's COVID-19 Funeral Assistance Helpline at 1-844-884-8333 (TTY: 800-482-7585) from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. ET, Monday – Friday and begin the application process.

The CHWs serve as partners and coaches to help connect clients to resources and services so they can take charge of their health and achieve healthier lives for themselves and for their babies. They work together to identify risks and manage them, one by one.

OUR PURPOSE

To reduce infant mortality by eliminating barriers to health and well-being for at-risk pregnant women. This initiative serves all at-risk women, but we focus on African American and Hispanic women due to the impact that poor birth outcomes and infant mortality have in these specific populations.

OUR MISSION

To improve birth outcomes by using the Community Pathways HUB Model to find those women at greatest risk, treat their unique challenges by connecting them to effective interventions, and measure program successes.
