AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

DATE	TIME	LOCATION	NEIGHBORHOOD
8/2/2021	0842	723 N KEOWEE ST	MCCOOK FIELD
SYNOPSIS: Victim advised that he was struck with a club numerous times by an acquaintance.			
CASE STATUS: Detective attempted to make contact with the victim, but was met with negative results.			
8/3/2021	1200	1556 HUFFMAN AV	EASTERN HILLS
SYNOPSIS: Known suspect struck an officer's cruiser when he attempted to stop him in a stolen vehicle. The suspect was taken into custody and transported to the Montgomery County Jail without incident.			
CASE STATUS: Charges were presented to the Montgomery County Prosecutor's Office and refused for stolen property and felonious assault, but were accepted for possession of drugs.			
8/5/2021	1249	100 S JERSEY ST	BURKHARDT
SYNOPSIS: Known suspect fled a traffic stop from officers. The suspect then intentionally struck the officer's cruiser. After a short pursuit and losing sight of the suspect and vehicle, the suspect crashed and fled. He was located and arrested a short time later. After being examined at Miami Valley Hospital and being released, he was transported to the Montgomery County Jail.			
CASE STATUS: Charges were presented to the Montgomery County Prosecutor's Office and approved.			
8/7/2021	1845	3425 E FIFTH ST	WRIGHT VIEW
SYNOPSIS: The victim was driving with her children when a known suspect struck her vehicle, The suspect was arrested and transported to the Montgomery County Jail. This is domestic related.			
CASE STATUS: Charges were presented to the Montgomery County Prosecutor's Office and refused.			
8/8/2021	2330	4534 ELLIOT AV	HEARTHSTONE
SYNOPSIS: Known suspect got into a physical altercation with the victim in which they ended up in the parking lot near the suspect's mother's vehicle. When the victim started to walk away, the suspect got into the driver's seat, accelerated the vehicle, and struck the victim causing injuries.			
CASE STATUS: Detective made contact with the victim's father and the victim. The broadcast for the suspect was extended until this could be presented to the prosecutor's office.

SYNOPSIS: Possible known suspect entered the victim's secured apartment by unknown means and stole a television along with some other valuable items.			
CASE STATUS: Detective attempted to make contact with the victim, but was met with negative results.

SYNOPSIS: Unknown suspect pried open the rear door to the victim's residence and walked in. When the suspect stated where's the money, the victim grabbed a knife and swung at the suspect. The victim's dogs then attempted to bite the suspect. The suspect then fled the scene.			
CASE STATUS: Detective attempted to make contact with the victim, but was met with negative results.

SYNOPSIS: Unknown suspect forced entry into the victim's detached garage and residence. The suspect stole miscellaneous tools and ransacked the victim's residence and garage. The victim's vehicle was also damaged.

SYNOPSIS: Known suspect entered the victim's residence through an unlocked window. The suspect damaged the victim's television and stole approximately six pairs of shoes.			
CASE STATUS: Detective attempted to make contact with the victim, but was met with negative results.

SYNOPSIS: Unknown suspect forced entry into the business and stole the money out of the touch tunes music machine. No cameras were observed in the area that would have caught this incident.

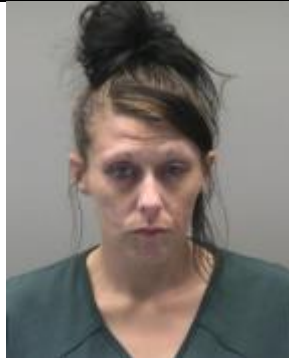

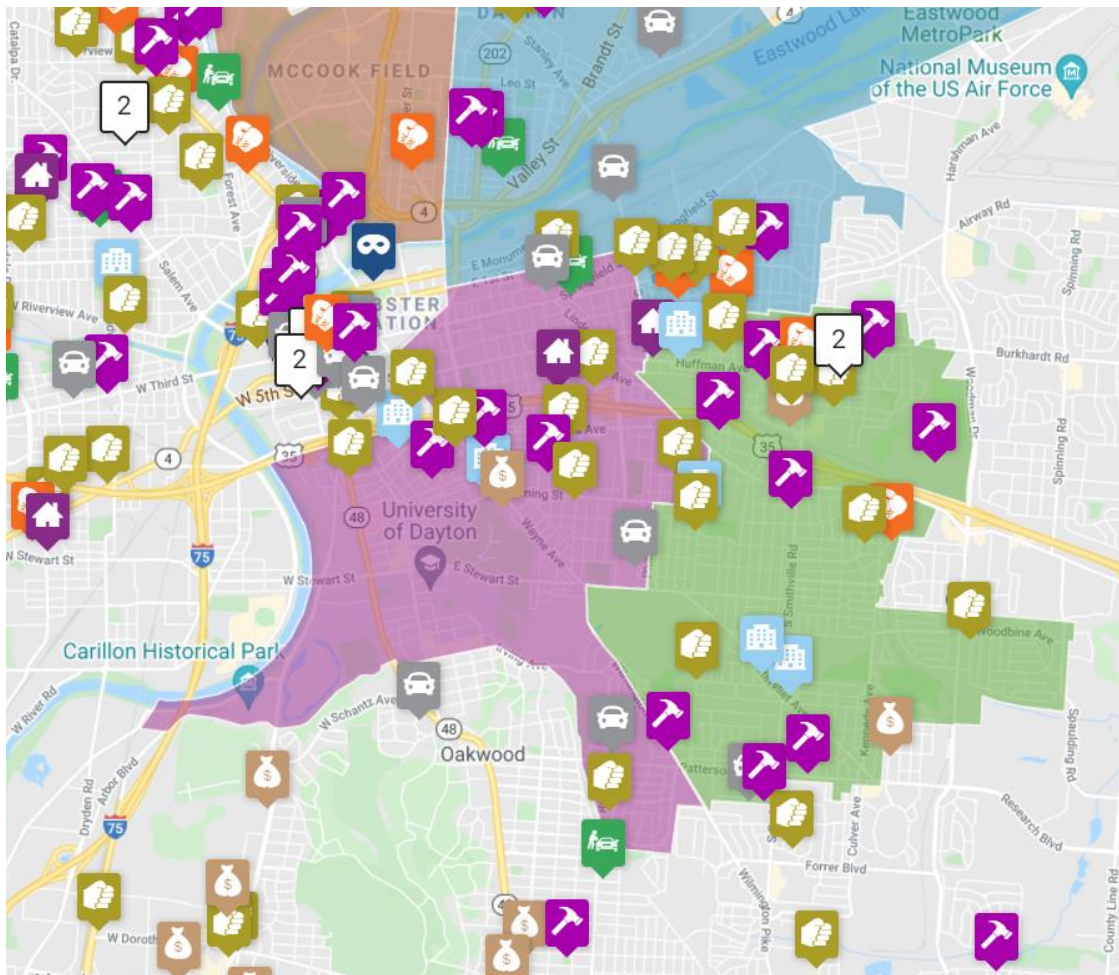
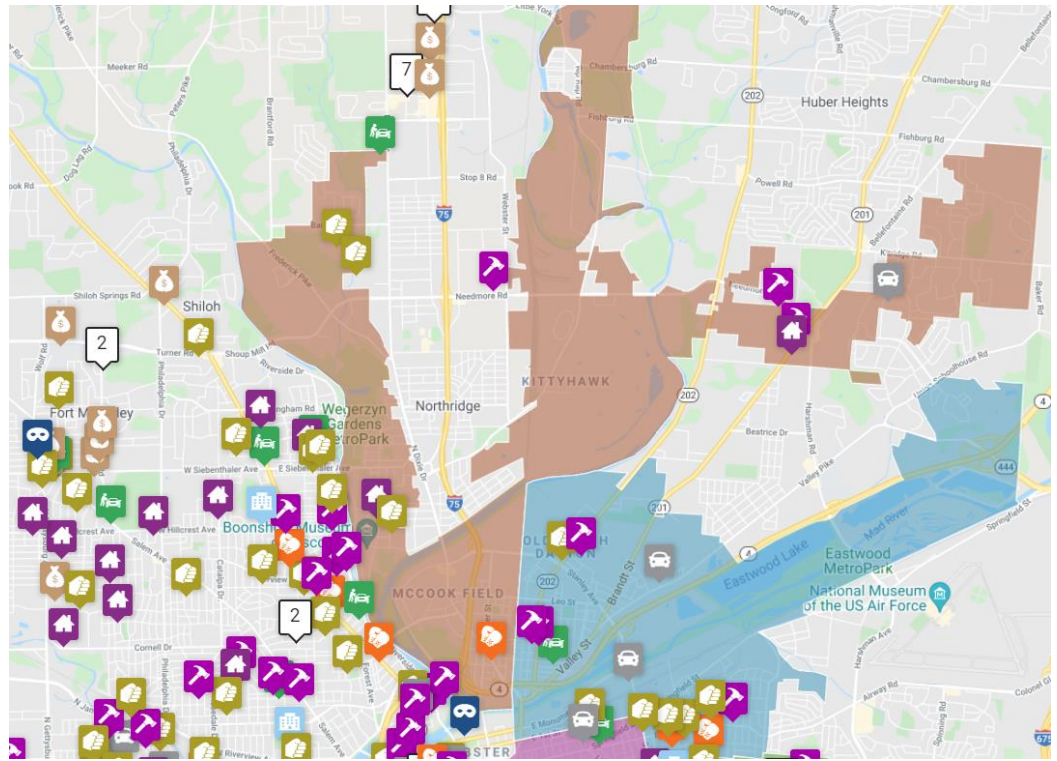

How to Prevent Trailer Thefts



- Use a hitch lock- this makes it more time consuming for thieves to steal your trailer
- Park your trailer in a well-lit area- most criminals do not want to be seen committing crimes
- You can also park your trailer in an area such as a fenced backyard or garage
- Make sure you have the license plate or registration information written down
- Mark your trailer with identifiable marks
- Block the tires with tire blocks or cinder blocks
- Lock your wheels
- Remember, if you see something, say something

Catalytic converter theft

is on the rise in your neighborhood

An exhaust admission control device that reduces toxic gases and pollutants in exhaust gas

Contains valuable metals such as platinum

SUV's, because of their height, (easier to get to converter) and lighter weight cars, such as the Prius, (easier to jack up, if needed) are common targets, but all types of vehicles are prone to this theft. It only takes about 5 minutes to steal your converter.



What can you do to prevent Catalytic converter thefts?

- Park your car in your garage whenever possible
- Park in a well-lit area
- Set your car alarm to pick up vibrations
- Use motion sensor lights in your driveway

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE FRAUD ALERT

This is a Fraud Alert from the Office of Inspector General at the U.S. Department of Labor.

Fraudsters are perpetrating numerous schemes related to the COVID-19 pandemic. In one scheme, scammers have offered to help individuals file claims for unemployment benefits. The scammers then ask for personal information including social security numbers and dates of birth. The scammers may ask you to provide payment, or your credit card information, in assisting you in filing or qualifying for your unemployment benefits. You do not need to pay anyone to file or qualify for your benefits.

Unsolicited calls, social media platforms, and door-to-door visits are several ways that individuals have been targeted.

Be aware that your personal information may be used fraudulently without your permission.

Victims of these scams face potential harm. The personal information the scammers collect may be used to commit identity theft to file fraudulent unemployment insurance claims.
