Motor Vehicle Theft

10/09/2021	0000	200 N Patterson	Victim reported he had parked at a meter and when he returned his vehicle was missing. Victim called back to report he had located his vehicle and forgot he had parked it at a different location.

Assault

10/06/2021	1630	15 N Main St	Victim was sitting at courthouse square when he was approached by the suspect. The suspect began to accuse him of stealing his cell phone. He stated as time went on the argument became more heated and the suspect took out a Sawzall and swung it at him striking him in the right side of the head.
10/10/2021	0215	13 N Ludlow St	Victim reported she was staying with the suspect in a homeless camp on the second floor of a parking garage downtown. Over the past five days, after having sexual intercourse with the suspect, he became controlling. During an argument, he became extremely angry at her; twisting her arm and punching her in the face. Catalytic converter theft

is on the rise in your neighborhood

An exhaust admission control device that reduces toxic gases and pollutants in exhaust gas

Contains valuable metals such as platinum

SUV's, because of their height, (easier to get to converter) and lighter weight cars, such as the Prius, (easier to jack up, if needed) are common targets, but all types of vehicles are prone to this theft. It only takes about 5 minutes to steal your converter.



What can you do to prevent Catalytic converter thefts?

- Park your car in your garage whenever possible
- Park in a well-lit area
- Set your car alarm to pick up vibrations
- Use motion sensor lights in your driveway
