10/12/2021	2234	300 S Main St	Victim, who has mental health issues and repeatedly calls the police, stated that someone struck him in the mouth.
10/14/2021	1930	220 Park Manor	Victim reported that the suspect open hand slapped him in the back of the head, knocking his hat off. Suspect denied slapping him, but did stated his hat fell off when they got in each other's face.
10/16/2021	0056	211 S Wilkinson	Victim reported he allowed the female suspect to stay with him. He explained that she asked for \$30 to buy crack cocaine. When he told her he did not have any money, she struck him on the head with a hammer. Neighbor heard the incident take place and witnessed the female leaving the apartment as she yelled, "called the police." The suspect stated that the victim was choking her. After medics checked them both out, the suspect was issued a summons for assault due to their levels of intoxication.
10/17/2021	0000	418 E Fifth St	Victim reported that the bouncer from Newcoms Tavern placed him in a rear choke hold and he wanted to press charges. Officers were able to corroborate the victim's story through surveillance video.
10/17/2021	0000	211 S Wilkinson	Victim stated she was listening to music on her headphones near the front entry door of the Holden House. She was approached by the suspect, who immediately attacked her. Victim was not sure what she had been hit with or how many times.

# Catalytic converter theft

is on the rise in your neighborhood

An exhaust admission control device that reduces toxic gases and pollutants in exhaust gas

Contains valuable metals such as platinum

SUV's, because of their height, (easier to get to converter) and lighter weight cars, such as the Prius, (easier to jack up, if needed) are common targets, but all types of vehicles are prone to this theft. It only takes about 5 minutes to steal your converter.



## What can you do to prevent Catalytic converter thefts?

- Park your car in your garage whenever possible
- Park in a well-lit area
- Set your car alarm to pick up vibrations
- Use motion sensor lights in your driveway
