Aggravated Assault

DATE	TIME	LOCATION	SYNOPSIS
10/30/2021	2050	211 S Wilkinson	Victim was arguing with her boyfriend who accused of cheating on him. The boyfriend punched the victim and used a box cutter to try and stab her. She blocked the first attack but suffered a deep laceration to her thumb. As she tried to flee, he managed to stab her in the palm with the box cutter. She was able to flee and call the police from a neighbor's apartment.

10/31/2021	0345	126 W Fifth St	Victim stated he was walking from the BP station and when near Ludlow and Franklin Street, an older B/M attempted to rob him. The suspect produced a knife and cut the victim on the right arm. The victim was able to get away and flee to the high-rise where the police were called. Victim suffered non-life-threatening injuries and was treated at MVH.
10/31/2021	1255	123 W Third St	Victim reported he was cutting through the parking garage when he was approached by the suspect. The suspect asked for some money to purchase food. As he reached into his satchel to give the suspect money, the suspect pulled out a black handgun. The suspect demanded the satchel and took off running. Crews were not able to locate the suspect.

Assault

10/29/2021	2301	33 E Fifth St	Suspect walked into the lobby of the Radisson Hotel asking to use the bathroom to wash his hands. After approximately 20 minutes, security went in to check on the suspect who was still in the bathroom. The asked him to leave the property and he refused, cursing at them loudly in the lobby. After escorting him off the property, he continued to curse at them loudly. Security advised him to leave or they would call the police. The suspect became furious and punched one of the guards with a closed fist. After a brief fight, the suspect attempted to flee as officers arrived. The suspect was taken into custody by responding officers. He was booked for assault and an Aggravated Robbery warrant.

Catalytic converter theft

is on the rise in your neighborhood

An exhaust admission control device that reduces toxic gases and pollutants in exhaust gas

Contains valuable metals such as platinum

SUV's, because of their height, (easier to get to converter) and lighter weight cars, such as the Prius, (easier to jack up, if needed) are common targets, but all types of vehicles are prone to this theft. It only takes about 5 minutes to steal your converter.



What can you do to prevent Catalytic converter thefts?

- Park your car in your garage whenever possible
- Park in a well-lit area
- Set your car alarm to pick up vibrations
- Use motion sensor lights in your driveway
