AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

DATE	TIME	LOCATION	NEIGHBORHOOD
12/2/2021	0242	3011 WAYNE AV	WALNUT HILLS

SYNOPSIS: The victim and unknown suspect got into an argument in Carmichael's Bar after the victim defended the bartender. The suspect was being disrespectful and rude and was kicked out. As the victim and his friend's left at closing, the suspect was waiting outside. The victim got into his car and was attempting to exit the parking lot via that alley when his vehicle was surrounded by two other vehicles. The suspects (now there were more people) began assaulting the victim by punching and kicking him. One of the suspects was waving a black handgun in the air. The suspects then fled the scene. The victim was transported to Miami Valley Hospital with a brain bleed.

CASE STATUS: Detective spoke with the victim and his father as well as hospital staff. The bar owner advised that he has been having camera issues for the last couple months, but he would review what video he had to see if maybe the date and time were wrong.

AGGRAVATED ROBBERY

SYNOPSIS: The victim was delivering Chinese food to the noted residence when an unknown suspect that was sitting on the porch (the suspect did not belong at the address, he was just passing by and resting on the porch according to the person who ordered the chinese food). The victim got out of his vehicle to deliver the food, but left the driver side door open and the keys in the ignition with the vehicle running. The suspect pointed a gun at the victim and told him to go. The witness who lives at the noted address said his neighbor's have cameras, but they were not home when officers arrived to take the report.

CASE STATUS: After further investigation, the detective received permission and changed this for a motor vehicle theft to an aggravated robbery.

SYNOPSIS: Unknown suspect pointed a gun at the victim, grabbed the car keys, and drove off with the vehicle. The suspect accused the victim of stealing his gun and has been texting her since this incident occurred. The victim showed the messages to officers, but the victim refused to tell them what the suspect's name was or show them a picture of him.

CASE STATUS: No detective supplementary report entered at this time.

ROBBERY

SYNOPSIS: Known suspect followed the victim to Hookah Bazaar at the noted location. The suspect opened the victim's car door and yanked her out of the vehicle. The suspect grabbed the victim's gun that was under the front seat and put it in his waistband. The suspect assaulted the victim. When the suspect attempted to get into the rear driver side passenger door, the victim was able to put the vehicle in drive and flee to Miami Valley Hospital, where officers met with the victim. Injuries were observed by officers and documented.

CASE STATUS: Detective made contact with the victim and clarified the events that took place. Charges were presented to the Montgomery County Prosecutor's Office and approved.

RESIDENTIAL BURGLARY

SYNOPSIS: Two known suspects pushed in the victim's air conditioning unit and unlocked the front door after screaming that the victim's friend sold them fake drugs. The suspects then stole the victim's television along with his identification cards and social security card. The suspects were arrested on scene.			
CASE STATUS: Charges were presented to the Montgomery County Prosecutor's Office and approved for both suspects.

SYNOPSIS: Unknown suspect forced entry into the victim's residence and punched a hole in her television. Officers observed the new damage to the door.			
CASE STATUS: Detective attempted to make contact with the victim, but was met with negative results.

SYNOPSIS: Unknown suspect entered the victim's residence by breaking a basement window. Some jewelry, a wallet, a handgun, and two goovls brand cameras were stolen.			
CASE STATUS: Detective made contact with the victim, who provided no new information regarding this incident.

SYNOPSIS: Known suspect arrived at the victim's residence. When the victim's daughter would not let the suspect inside, he damaged the DP&L meter on the side of the house and damaged the detached garage by breaking the windows and bending the bars. <p>CASE STATUS: Detective made contact with the victim, who advised the trailer was recovered.</p>

<p>SYNOPSIS: Unknown suspect stole the victim's vehicle that was left unlocked and running with the keys in the ignition while he let the vehicle warm up.</p>			
<p>CASE STATUS: Detective attempted to make contact with the victim, but was met with negative results. The detective attempted to locate the vehicle information, but the vehicle was never registered to the victim, so a broadcast was not able to be completed.</p>			
12/1/2021	2206	1822 BROWN ST	UNIVERSITY PARK
<p>SYNOPSIS: Two unknown suspects stole the victim's vehicle that was left unlocked and running with the keys in the ignition while he ran inside to pickup a doordash order, leaving his child in the vehicle. The suspects dumped the child approximately 50 feet away from where the victim initially parked his vehicle. The suspects were later located on the west side of Dayton via the victim's GPS on his phone. The juvenile suspects were interviewed.</p>			
<p>CASE STATUS: Detective made contact with the victim, who provided more evidence that may be helpful for this case.</p>

<p>SYNOPSIS: No report entered at this time.</p>			
<p>CASE STATUS: No detective supplementary report entered at this time.</p>			
12/1/2021	0700	1556 HUFFMAN AV	EASTERN HILLS
<p>SYNOPSIS: Unknown suspect stole the victim's vehicle that was parked at gas pump number one while he ran inside to get a drink. The victim thought he had the key fob, but later stated that he may have left it in his unlocked vehicle. This incident was caught on video.</p>			
<p>CASE STATUS: Detectives responded to the gas station to try and obtain a copy of the video, but no one on scene had access to the system.</p>

<p>SYNOPSIS: Unknown suspect stole the victim's broken down vehicle that he parked at this address. The victim owns this address, but does not live there and the vehicle has not be running for approximately two years.</p>

<p>CASE STATUS: No detective supplementary report entered at this time.</p>			

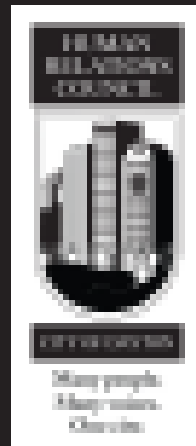
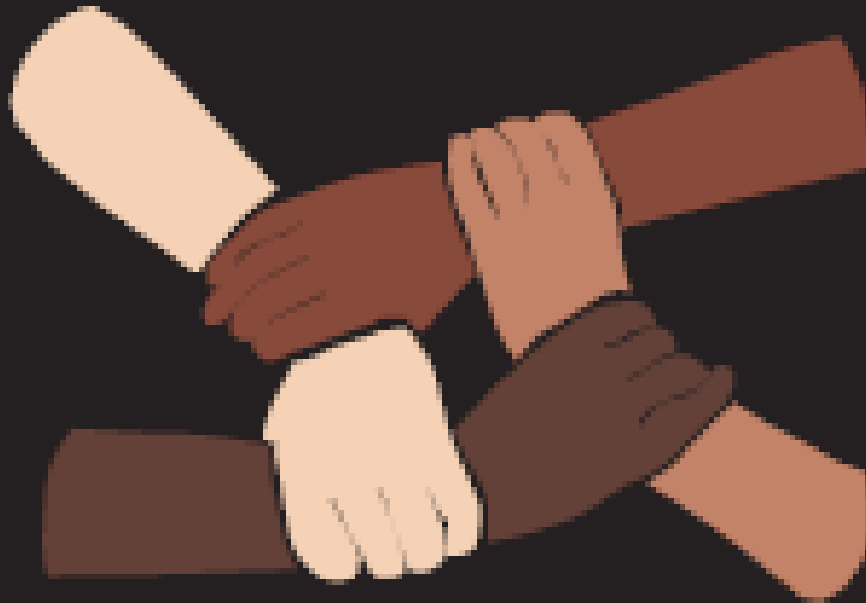

<p>SYNOPSIS: Unknown suspect entered the victim's unlocked vehicle and stole some cash, school books, and a receipt. The victim indicated there may be possible video footage of this incident.</p> <p>CASE STATUS: Detective made contact with the victim, who advised he would contact Mahle to see if there was possible video footage of this incident. The security guard called and advised this incident was not caught on video.</p>

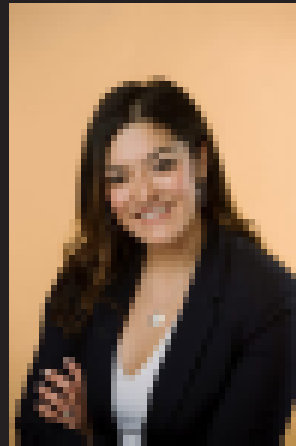

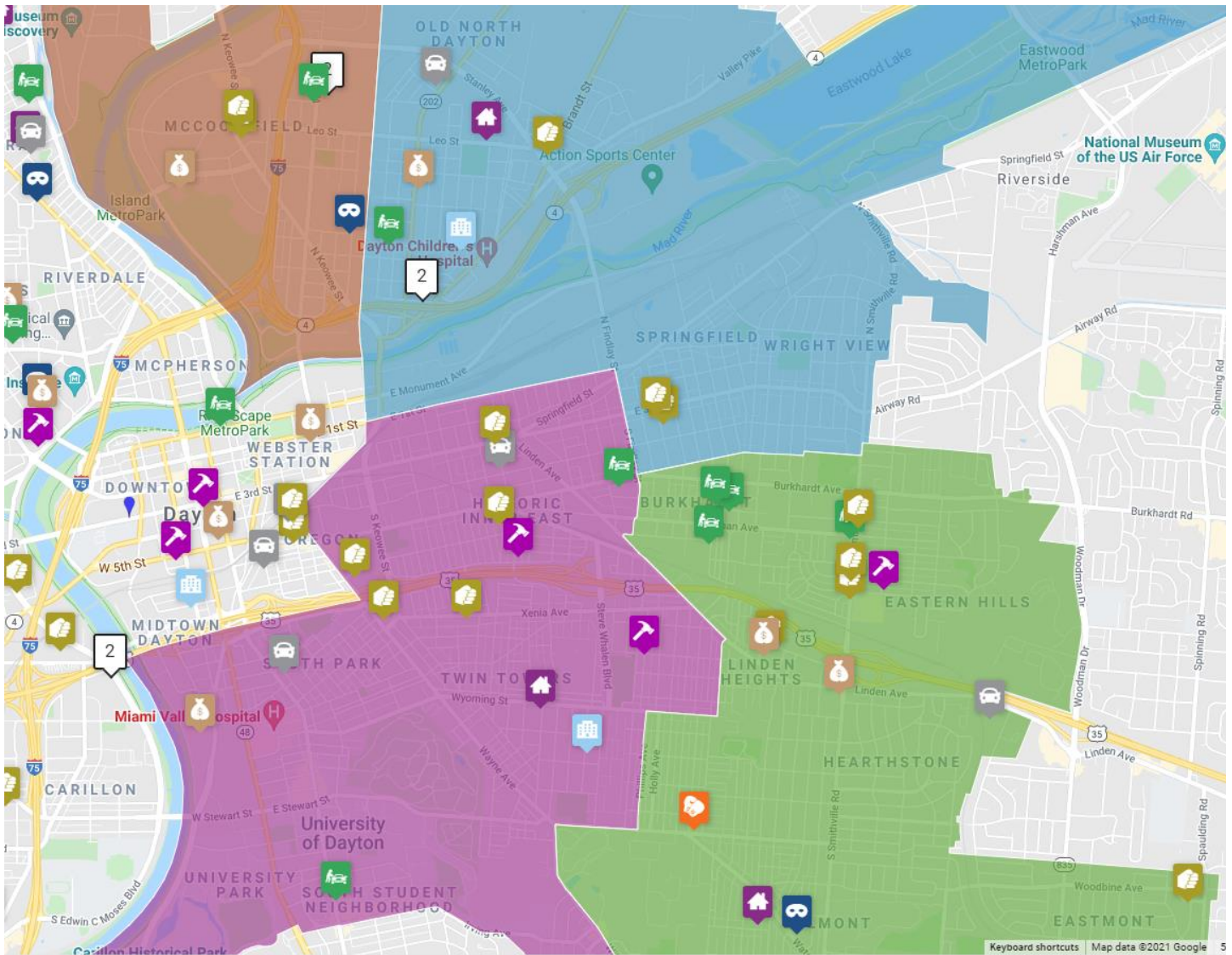
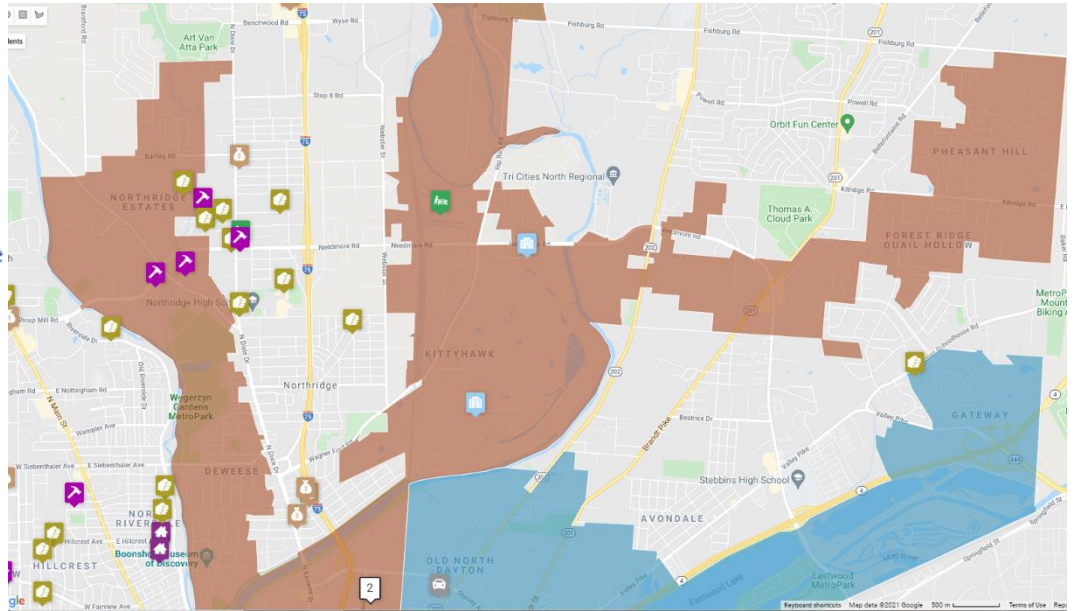
