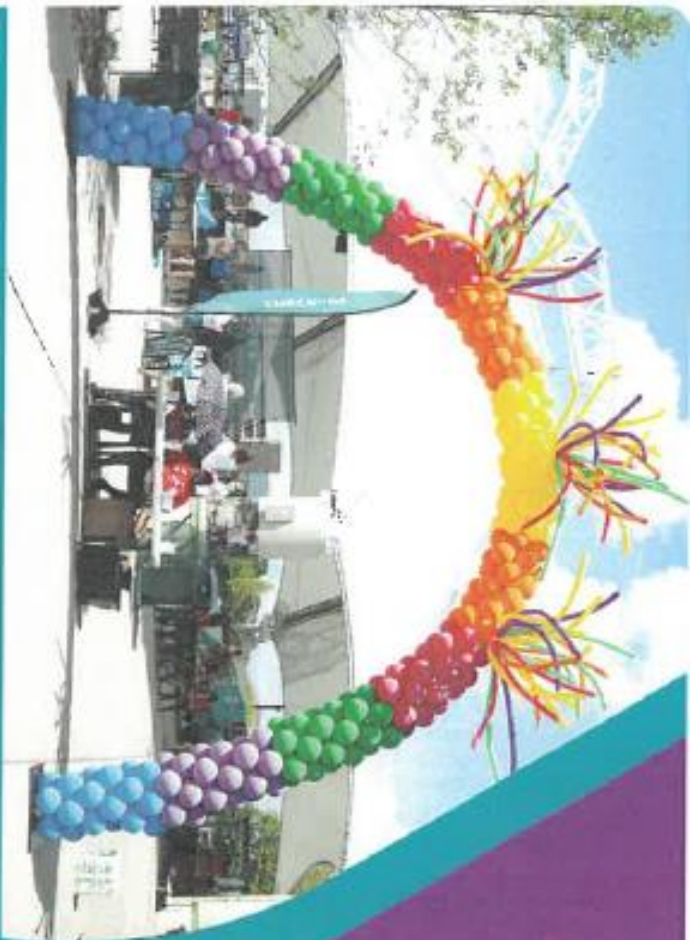

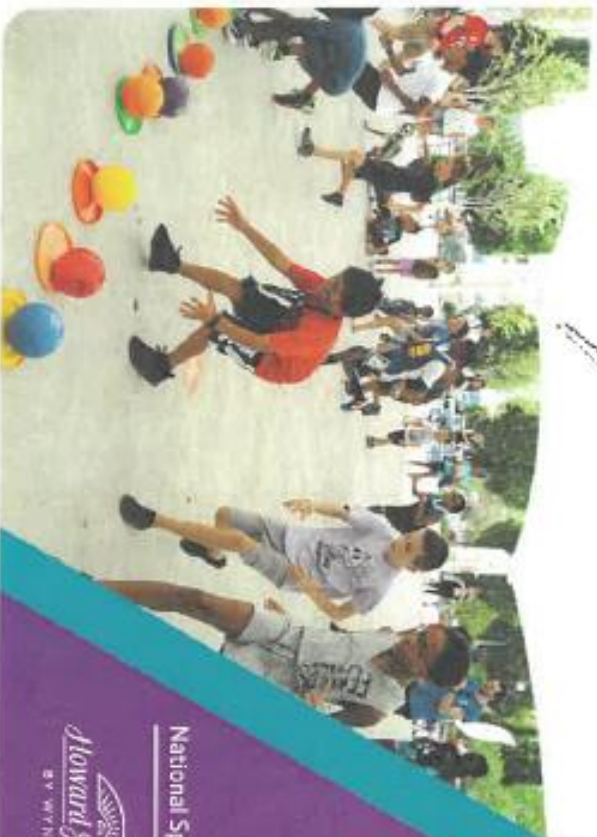

CPTED: The Basics

Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design, or CPTED (“sep-ted”), is an approach that, when properly applied, supports the intended use of a space by helping establish who it is for and what counts as appropriate or inappropriate behavior in it.

There are three overlapping principles at the core of CPTED:

1. **Natural Surveillance**
2. **Natural Access Control**
3. **Territorial Reinforcement**

CPTED is an internationally recognized method of signaling nonverbal, environmental cues to reduce opportunities for crime and fear of crime and is a powerful tool for law enforcement, architects, planners, historic preservationists, individual property owners, and community.

CPTED utilizes natural surveillance and natural access control to create an environment where the intended users of a space feel safe enough that they develop a sense of belonging with it. This feeling of stewardship, or territorial reinforcement, along with environmental and social cues that signal what type of behavior is appropriate and what is not, makes lawful users less likely to overlook deviance and makes wrongdoers less confident about intruding.

While natural measures are most widely preferred, there are also strategies for achieving surveillance and access control that are mechanical and organizational in nature.

CPTED Strategies

- **Surveillance**
- **Access Control**
- **Territorial Reinforcement**

- *The ability to see and be seen, or hear or be heard, by others*

Good sight lines and reasons to watch others as they go about their activities make legitimate users of a space feel like if they were threatened, someone might intervene on their behalf. "Built-in" eyes and ears also increase a criminal's risk of being caught (or least make them think they will be).

Surveillance can be natural (open sightlines, visually permeable fencing), mechanical (cameras), or organizational (parking lot attendant)
