AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

SYNOPSIS: The victim was hanging out at the noted address when the suspect approached him and called him a foul name and told him to leave. When the victim stated no, the suspect pulled out a handgun and hit the victim in the face with it. The victim then left the scene and called the police.

SYNOPSIS: The victim and his girlfriend were sitting at the light at the noted address when they were approached by the two suspects. When the victim refused to give the suspects money, one pulled out a gun and held it to the victim's head while the other struck the victim in the face numerous times. The victim went for treatment shortly after taking a nap due to possible concussion symptoms.

FAILURE TO COMPLY

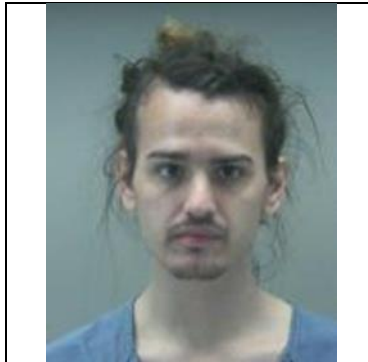

Catalytic Converter

THEFT PREVENTION

- Park in well-lit areas.
- Park close to curbs to deter access underneath your vehicle.
- When possible, park your vehicle in a garage.
- Alarm systems can be calibrated to activate upon vibration.
- Ensure your video system at home captures where your vehicle is parked.
- Next time you take your car in for service, ask the mechanic to engrave your license plate number on your catalytic converter. Then use a permanent marker over the engraving so it can be easily identified.
- Security devices are available to attach to your catalytic converter to make it more difficult to remove.

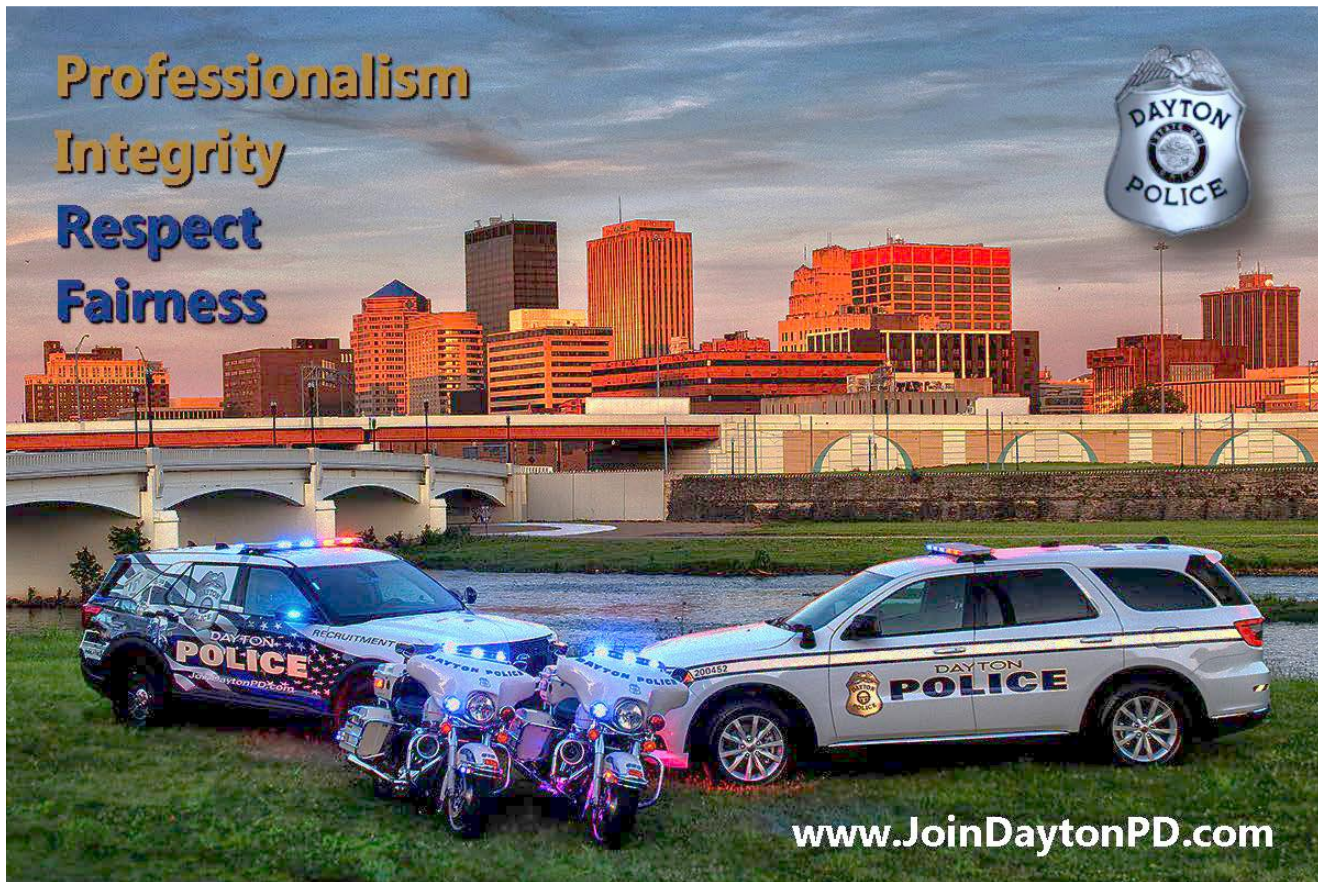

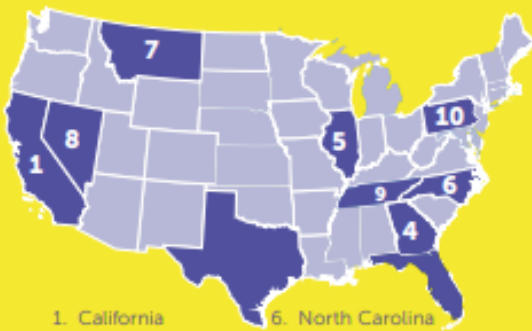

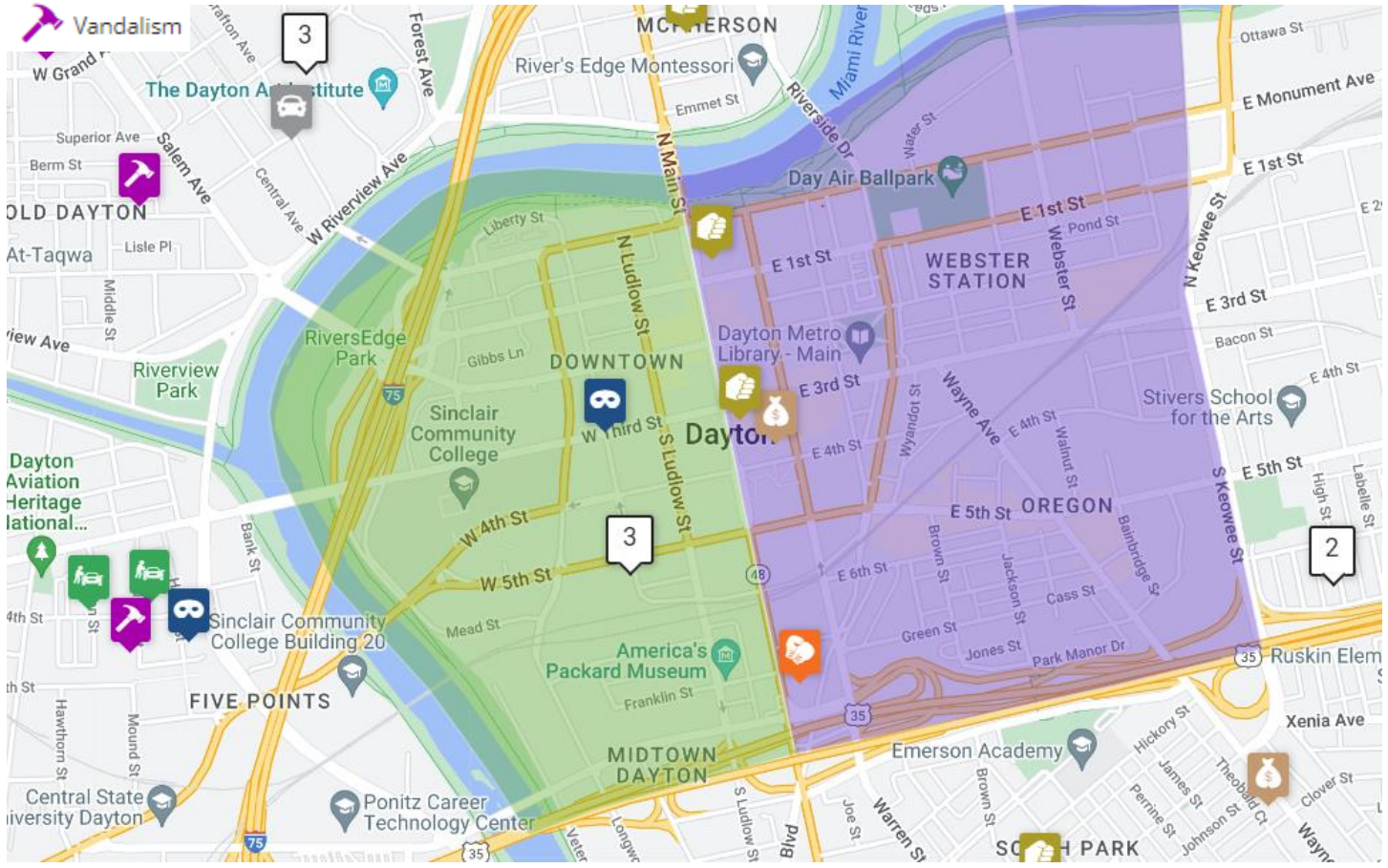
