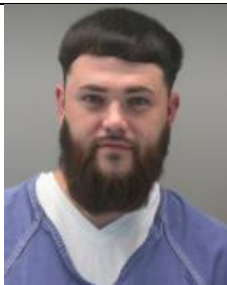

Clearing a building, one room at a time, while searching for a suspect, is one of the most dangerous things an officer will do during their career.

In this class you will take the role of a police officer responding to an alarm on a building after business hours.

No one under 18 may attend this class, A basic background check is required before attending.

Catalytic Converter

THEFT PREVENTION

- Park in well-lit areas.
- Park close to curbs to deter access underneath your vehicle.
- When possible, park your vehicle in a garage.
- Alarm systems can be calibrated to activate upon vibration.
- Ensure your video system at home captures where your vehicle is parked.
- Next time you take your car in for service, ask the mechanic to engrave your license plate number on your catalytic converter. Then use a permanent marker over the engraving so it can be easily identified.
- Security devices are available to attach to your catalytic converter to make it more difficult to remove.

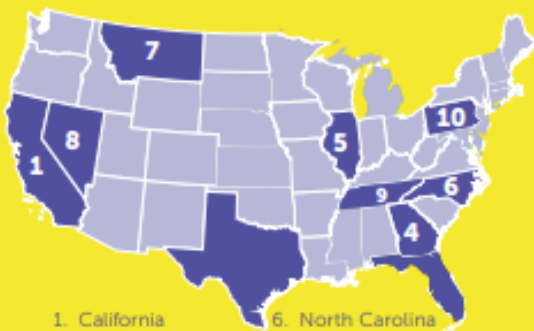
