Referrals will be accepted from Trotwood City Schools, Dayton Public Schools, Dayton Children's Hospital, Montgomery County Juvenile Court, Daybreak and other community agencies.

Car Seat Safety Program

The Car Seat Safety Program provides free car seats and training for families that are economically disadvantaged. Offering the class ensures that parents and caregivers know how to properly install and use car seats, which mean children stay safe.

A Partner On Your Personal Journey

Goodwill Easterseals Miami Valley understands that safety seats can be expensive to purchase, and sometimes difficult to use properly. We also know that safely securing your child when he or she is riding in the car can help prevent injuries or deaths that often result from crashes. If you benefit from the WIC program or are eligible for Medicaid, we can help you keep your child safe during transportation by providing a child passenger safety seat.

Resources to Achieve Independence

- **Safety Seats** – If you live in the greater Miami Valley region and meet eligibility requirements, you can benefit from this valuable service made possible by our local partnerships. A donation per seat is requested.
- **Certified Technicians** – A certified technician will assist you with the installation of your new safety seat. You do not need to have a vehicle to receive a car seat, but it is best to install the seat in the vehicle your child will be riding in most.
- **Education** – Through a video and information session, you'll learn about the stages of safety seat use so that even after you receive your car seat you'll know how to keep your child safe as he or she grows up.
- **Resources** – If you or someone you know would like additional information about child passenger safety and the safe transportation of children, we can provide educational materials about special needs and travel safety for anyone who is caring for your child.

Between 2009 and 2022, there have been over 37 acts of targeted violence against houses of worship in the United States, including 64 deaths. Fifty-four percent of the attacks were an armed assault of some kind, including five attacks that qualified as mass shootings. Sixty-seven percent of the attacks were motivated by hatred of a particular racial or religious identity.

REGISTRATION - It is very important that details of the vehicle and the owner's name and contact information are recorded on the QR. To register go to www.dhsa.org "ISR Form" select "Catalytic Converter" then select "Registration - Catalytic Converter" or scan the QR code below.



UNIQUE CODE:



INFORMATION UPDATES - If the owner changes address or the vehicle or catalytic converter are stolen, it should be reported online at www.dhsa.org.

VERIFICATION - The secure marking and registration system provides an all-year-round, immediate verification service. This means that visiting a marked and registered item is very easy for clients to check on marked and registered items can be carried out online at www.dhsa.org or via the QR code on the block, at any time of the day or night.

ISR CONTACT CARD - The vehicle owner should keep the card use of the vehicle as it may be required for later use. In the event of a theft, this should be reported by visiting www.dhsa.org. The code shown in the red box above will be required. This is the same unique number with which the catalytic converter has been marked.
