



Dayton Recovery Plan supports neighborhood improvements

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Two projects supported by the Dayton Recovery Plan and approved by the City Commission on Oct. 18 will support quality of life for Dayton residents.

A \$64,755 agreement with A-1 Tree Care (Hillsboro, OH) for tree and stump removal service will consist of removing 60 hazardous trees and 41 tree stumps in the Westwood neighborhood. The trees and stumps are in the public right-of-way, usually between a sidewalk and a street. Their removal will improve safety and the appearance of the neighborhood. Work is expected to be complete by early 2024.

A \$774,332 contract will allow significant improvements to Liberation Park on North Broadway Street. The L.J. DeWeese Company (Tipp City, OH) will install a park shelter, playground equipment, a restroom foundation and utilities, and a new parking lot. Work should be complete by June of 2024.

The approved Liberation Park enhancements follow the Oct. 4 approval of another Dayton Recovery Plan contract for replacement of restrooms at the park. In June of 2022, the park's name was changed from Dayton View Park to Liberation Park, in collaboration with West Dayton community groups.

The Dayton Recovery Plan is a \$138 million framework for community COVID relief and investment for the future, made possible by the federal American Rescue Plan Act.
