



Additional park improvements are the latest Dayton Recovery Plan investments

The City of Dayton will complete additional park improvements through Dayton Recovery Plan investments, following approval of contracts by the City Commission on Nov. 1.

When the improvements are complete, Five Oaks Park and Gettysburg Park will have new sidewalks, curbs, and parking surfaces funded by the Dayton Recovery Plan.

These enhancements will complement new visitor amenities (including shelters, restrooms, sports courts and more) funded by other sources, resulting in a vastly improved visitor experience at the parks.

Work at both parks will be completed by Outdoor Enterprises, LLC, with \$353,451 contributed by the Dayton Recovery Plan.

This newest round of park enhancements follows extensive improvements at other City of Dayton parks also funded by the Dayton Recovery Plan in 2023. These parks include Triangle, McIntosh and Bomberger.

The Dayton Recovery Plan is a \$138 million framework for community COVID relief and investment for the future, made possible by the federal American Rescue Plan Act.
