Plane Crash at Dayton International Airport

Dayton, OH – At approximately 3 p.m. today a twin-engine Cessna aircraft crash landed at the Dayton International Airport. The aircraft landed on runway 24L.

This was a general aviation, non-commercial aircraft. The flight was destined for Dayton, with four people on board. Upon landing at roughly 1,000 feet down the runway the nose gear collapsed. No injuries were reported.

Commercial flights were halted for approximately 30 minutes. The airport has three active runways. The airport reopened, utilizing one runway until the damaged aircraft was removed.
