



Dayton Recovery Plan funds new Wolf Creek housing

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The Dayton Recovery Plan will support construction of two new homes in Wolf Creek, one of the Plan's focus neighborhoods.

On Feb. 21, the Dayton City Commission approved a \$400,000 agreement with G. F. Bailey, which will build the market-rate houses. City of Dayton staff reviewed competitive proposals submitted by four firms expressing interest in the development opportunity.

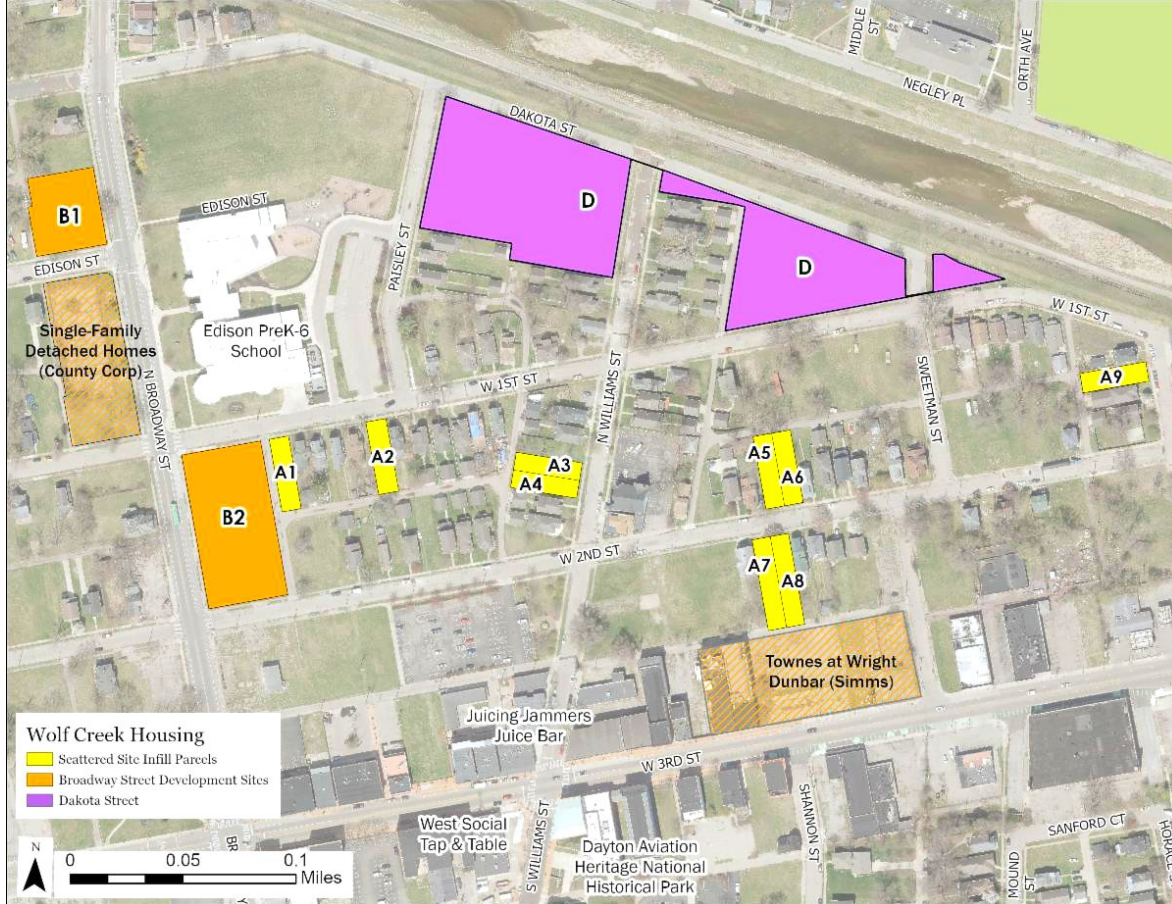
The single-family homes will be owner-occupied and are two of dozens planned or proposed for Wolf Creek, using a variety of funding and development resources including the Dayton Recovery Plan.

The Dayton Recovery Plan will invest approximately \$12 million in housing in Dayton neighborhoods.

The Dayton Recovery Plan is the City of Dayton's roadmap for investment of \$138 million in federal American Rescue Plan Act funds dedicated to recovering from the COVID-19 pandemic. Dayton's goal for the funding is to create long-term transformational and sustainable impacts in targeted areas, as well as special initiatives with impact citywide.
