For 50 years, Dayton neighborhoods and communities in the region have benefitted from the federal Community Development Block Grant.

The Cities of Dayton and Kettering, in cooperation with Montgomery County, will celebrate five decades of impact with a Community Development Celebration on Saturday, April 27, from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., at the Dayton Bike Yard (1437 S. Edwin C. Moses Blvd.). The community is welcome to join the celebration.

The event will include music, food, and cycling demonstrations. There will also be a resource fair for residents and community service organizations.

In Dayton, the Community Development Block Grant has supported housing renovation, neighborhood stabilization projects, street and alley resurfacing, small business development, and community assets including the Dayton Bike Yard.

## CDBG IMPACT IN U.S.

In 2021, the CDBG program provided grants to 1,235 state and local governments. Since 2005, the CDBG





program has rehabilitated 1,300,027 unites of housing, funded public infrastructure projects that assisted over 16 million people, and assisted over 161 million people with public services.

## CDBG IMPACT IN DAYTON

Since 2019, 7.4 Million dollars of CDBG funding was invested in Housing Stabilization and Improvement Programs including nuisance abatement program and housing projects.



## ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT



Since 2019, 1.5 Million dollars of CDBG funding was allocated to Economic Development Programs including small business resource assistance programs.

## PUBLIC AND SOCIAL SERVICE SUPPORT

Since 2019, 3.2 Million dollars in CDBG funds was invested in Public and Social Service Support Programs such as housing counseling and financial wellness through the Homeownership Center as well as Homefull's healthy living center.



## INFRASTRUCTURE

Since 2019, 14.7 Million dollars of CDBG funds was invested in Infrastructure & Neighborhood Conservation Programs such as residential asphalt and alley resurfacing.

## DID YOU KNOW?

\$1.5 million in CDBG funds was used toward the Dayton Bike Yard. The Bike Yard at Welcome Park is an amazing recreational opportunity for local youth and families in the heart of the Carillon neighborhood. This new regional amenity provides an gathering space for outdoor enthusiasts of all skill levels to enjoy the feeling of freedom and adventure on their bicycles.
