EARNED INCOME TAX CREDIT

EITC



Put extra cash in your pocket!

The earned income credit (EITC or EIC) is a refundable tax credit for low- to moderate-income working individuals and couples, particularly those with children.

You may qualify (SEE GUIDELINES BELOW)!



**EITC up to
\$7,830**

If you lived with **three or more children** in 2024 and your family **earned a max of \$59,899 (or a max of \$66,819 for married workers)**, then you can get up to **\$7,830**.



**EITC up to
\$6,960**

If you lived with **two children** in 2024 and your family **earned a max of \$55,768 (or a max of \$62,688 for married workers)**, then you can get up to **\$6,960**.



**EITC up to
\$4,213**

If you lived with **one child** in 2024 and your family **earned a max of \$49,084 (or a max of \$56,004 for married workers)**, then you can get up to **\$4,213**.



**EITC up to
\$632**

If you had **no children** living with you in 2024 and you **earned a max of \$18,591 (or a max of \$25,511 for married workers)**, and you were between the ages 25 and 64, you can get up to **\$632**.

Get Free Help Filing Your Tax Return! Fast Refunds, No Fees!

IRS-trained volunteers are available to help EITC eligible workers fill out their tax forms for free. **Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) sites are open from January 25th through April 15th.**

For information about other FREE tax preparation sites in the Dayton area, call 937-913-2000

You must bring the following items to the tax preparation sites:

- Photo ID
- W-2 Forms for wages earned in 2024
- Social Security (S.S.) cards or Individual Taxpayer Identification Numbers (ITIN) for you and all persons in your family included on your tax return
- If you had Child Care expenses in 2024 bring the Provider's S.S. # or Employer ID Number (EIN) and address. Also, bring payment documentation for the total amount you paid to the Provider, and the amount you paid for each child.

- Any correspondence you received from the IRS in 2024 and 1098 & 1099 forms (if any)
- If you want your refund directly deposited into your savings and/ or checking account(s) bring your account number(s) with you to the tax site.
- If you are married filing jointly, both parties must be present in order to process the tax return.

Don't bring your DORA cup into another place that **sells DORA beverages**



DON'T bring your DORA beverage into a retailer displaying a **"no DORA allowed" sign**



DON'T **leave the boundaries** of the DORA with your beverage



DON'T **leave your trash** on a public table or in the streets

Licensing & Microchips



LICENSE VS. MICROCHIP

In Ohio, the law states all dogs three months of age and older must have (and wear!) a valid year license. Dog Licenses are sold every year from Dec. 1 through Jan. 31 and can be purchased at the County Administration Building, the Animal Resource Center (ARC), or at one of our many outposts listed on our website. You may also choose to purchase your license online by visiting www.mcohio.org/dogs.

Microchips are an optional and permanent additional form of identification. The procedure is simple and consists of injecting a radio-frequency identification implant under the loose skin between a dog's shoulder blades; no anesthetic is required and the process takes only seconds. Once properly implanted, you must register your pet's microchip in a database with your contact information.

WHY SHOULD I LICENSE MY DOG?

Aside from the fact that it's the law, there are many benefits to licensing your dog:

- Montgomery County dog licenses can be traced 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, making it your dog's ticket home
- Licensed dogs are held 14 days before becoming property of the County, compared to three days for those without a license
- Reduced impoundment fees

Often, we're asked "why should I license my dog if they have a microchip?" Simply put - a dog license is the only **legal proof of ownership** in Ohio. So even if your dog is chipped, a license is required.

REVENUE COLLECTED THROUGH THE SALE OF DOG LICENSES IS THE ARC'S MAJOR SOURCE OF FUNDING, ALLOWING US TO CARE FOR STRAY AND LOST DOGS.

WHY SHOULD I MICROCHIP MY DOG?

Things happen, and dogs get lost. Unfortunately, sometimes they slip out of their collars or dash out the door, leaving them lost without a license. A microchip provides additional, permanent ID that cannot fall off, be removed, or become difficult to read.

At ARC, we don't believe pets are "like" family - they ARE family. Taking the simple and inexpensive step to have your dog microchipped helps ensure your furry family member can be safely returned where they belong - home.

HOW OFTEN DO I HAVE TO RENEW MY DOG'S LICENSE?

Dog licenses are available for renewal on an annual basis from Dec. 1 through Jan. 31. After these dates, penalty fees may apply. If you would like to purchase a three-year or permanent dog license, they are exclusively sold by the Auditor's Office located in the Montgomery County Administration building at 451 West Third St. Dayton, OH 45422.

WHAT ABOUT OUR FELINE FRIENDS?

Ohio law does not require cats to be licensed like dogs. Of course, we encourage all owners to take every precaution to keep their pet safe. Cats can also be microchipped and owners can attach ID tags to their collars with their contact information.

DOES ARC MICROCHIP?
