**Re: Programmatic Agreement for HUD-funded programs and invitation to participate in Section 106 consultation about projects carried out under these programs**

City of Dayton – Notice of Opportunity to Comment on the Execution of a Programmatic Agreement Pursuant to Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act

Date of Publication: May 21, 2025

Comment Period Ends: June 4, 2025

In accordance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, the City of Dayton is providing public notice regarding its intent to execute a new Programmatic Agreement (PA) with the Ohio State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) to streamline compliance for projects that utilize funding from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD).

The Programmatic Agreement outlines the process the City will follow to assess and consider the potential effects of federally funded, City-administered projects on historic properties. As part of this process, the City is required to notify and engage local and county historical societies, as well as preservation organizations and other consulting parties with a potential interest in historic preservation.

The City invites organizations and individuals interested in participating in the Section 106 consultation process to review the draft Programmatic Agreement and submit comments or request to become a consulting party. This is part of the City's effort to strengthen engagement and transparency in historic preservation matters.

How to Participate or Comment:

Interested parties may obtain a copy of the draft Programmatic Agreement and provide written comments during the 15-day comment period, which runs from May 21, 2025 through June 4, 2025.
