The Human Relations Council, in partnership with the Miami Valley Fair Housing Center, is proud to present the Housing Resource and Connection Fair, the next event in the Fair Housing Collaborative series. The free-admission event takes place on Saturday, Oct. 11, from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m.. at the Dayton Kroc Center.

This open-house-style event is designed to connect residents with vital housing services and support systems. Attendees will have the opportunity to meet directly with tenant advocates, legal aid providers, fair housing organizations, re-entry programs, and more. The fair will also feature educational resources on tenant rights, eviction prevention, and pathways to homeownership.

The Housing Resource Connection Fair is designed to:

- + Connect community members with housing stakeholders and resources
- + Educate tenants on their rights, eviction processes, and self-help legal tools
- + Provide information on homeownership programs and financial literacy
- + Promote collaboration among housing service providers to support housing stability.

Confirmed partners include Dayton Tenant Union, Miami Valley Fair Housing Center, Advocates for Basic Legal Equality, Learn to Earn, Dayton Home Repair Network, Montgomery County Clerk of Court, Montgomery County Public Health, Dayton Mediation Center, Dayton Public Schools (McKinney-Vento Program), and others.
