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The Dayton Human Relations Council (HRC) invites the community to explore its recently launched community-police relations website at daytoncpr.org.

The Human Relations Council works with and on behalf of the Dayton City Commission, Dayton Police Department and the community to facilitate positive engagement and increased trust between law enforcement and neighborhoods served, to support safe and inclusive communities.

The new site will enhance the visibility of these programs, promote progress on various initiatives, and offer opportunities for the community to get involved and stay connected. Programs highlighted include the Community Police Council (CPC), the Community Initiative to Reduce Gun Violence (CIRGV), and the Citizens' Appeals Board (CAB).

Visitors will benefit from easily accessible information including links to important resources, access to an online Dayton Police Department complaint/commendation or appeals form, the CIRGV client intake form, a community engagement toolkit for hosting events, and related information from the 2017 Dayton Survey and Community Police Relations (CPR) data report.
