



Deputy City Managers Appointed

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City Manager Shelley Dickstein announced today the appointment of two veteran City employees to the role of Deputy City Manager, effective March 28.

Joe Parlette, currently Acting Assistant City Manager, and Tammi Clements, currently Director of the Department of Water, will each serve as Deputy City Manager.

The position of Assistant City Manager will be eliminated and a second Deputy City Manager position will be created. The change will allow more direct oversight and support to specific City departments and streamline communications.

Parlette will oversee some of the City's largest departments, including Police, Fire, Recreation and Youth Services, as well as Human Resources. A Wright State University graduate who began his career with the City in 1999, Parlette had been acting Assistant City Manager since October. Since 2013, he served as the Director of Recreation and Youth Services, managing a staff of 125 and a budget of \$10 million.

"Joe brings extensive municipal experience to this role," said Dickstein. "I am confident that he will foster a culture of coordination and teamwork by providing

attention and support to these critical departments."

Tammi Clements will oversee the Departments of Public Works, Water, Finance, Aviation and Central Services. She has served as Director of the Department of Water since 2007 and has 28 years of experience in municipal service in the fields of water, wastewater, and environmental management. She holds a B.S. in Biology and an MBA from Indiana Wesleyan University. As the Director of Water, she managed nearly 400 and a budget of \$95 million.

"Tammi has been a tremendous asset to the City of Dayton and it's a privilege to have a person of her caliber serving in such an important position," said Dickstein.

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
