



City Commission to attend meeting on June 9

The Dayton City Commission will be attending a meeting scheduled for Tuesday, June 9 beginning at 5:00 p.m. The meeting will be held remotely and will be available for citizens to watch live at daytonohio.gov/govtv.

The purpose of the meeting is to discuss the effects of racism as a public health issues.

This meeting is being held in accordance with changes to both state and local laws regarding public meetings during a state of emergency. In response to COVID-19 and in the interest of public health and welfare, Governor DeWine signed an emergency declaration on March 9, 2020, and the City of Dayton followed with an emergency proclamation on March 12, 2020. Additionally, the City of Dayton passed Emergency Ordinance 31797-20 on March 18, 2020, permitting City Commissioners to attend Commission meetings and public attendance via electronic means. Finally, on March 25, 2020, the Ohio legislature passed Amended Sub House Bill 197, which in Section 12(B) allows for public meetings and hearings to be conducted by electronic means.
