



## **City of Dayton Selects IGS Energy for Electricity Aggregation Program**

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Residents and most businesses paying for electric utility service in the City of Dayton will soon have an option to join an aggregation plan offering cost savings, following the City of Dayton's choice of IGS Energy as the supplier for the City's electric aggregation program.

Electric power aggregation permits a municipality to shop for and offer favorable group power rates for residents. Voters approved a proposal to allow the City of Dayton to develop a power aggregation plan in November of 2013.

Residents and businesses should look for a letter from IGS Energy and the City of Dayton providing more information on or around June 10.

Most residents will receive an "opt out" letter and will have 21 days to take action. If a utility customer wishes to be included in the program, no further action is necessary. If a customer has already selected a supplier, they may receive a similar letter with instructions on how to take advantage of the opportunity.

The aggregation program's initial price term will begin in August or September of 2016, depending on a customer's bill cycle, and continue through May 2017. Subsequent terms may be effective through the May 2019 bill cycle, subject to the City and IGS agreeing on future prices.

"The goal of the City's electricity aggregation program is to ensure that residents receive the best pricing and contract terms available each program year," City Manager Shelley Dickstein said. "Based on the proposals received by the City of Dayton, IGS Energy will allow the most cost savings for residents moving forward."

A Guaranteed Savings Rate has been established for the initial price term. The rate for eligible residential customers will be a 10% savings off Dayton Power & Light's (DP&L's) Price to Compare (PTC) for those who: 1) live in Dayton City proper, 2) who haven't already chosen an alternative electricity supplier, and 3) who are current on their DP&L utility bill. The rate for commercial customers will be a 5% savings off DP&L's PTC. Eligible commercial customers must be non-mercantile commercial customers using less than 700,000 kWh annually and meet the already listed criteria.



The subsequent years' offers (June 2017 thru May 2018 and June 2018 thru May 2019) will be consistent with a Guaranteed Savings Plan, but will be negotiated prior to each year's start. If IGS Energy and the City of Dayton cannot come to agreements on appropriate pricing plan options, the contract will be null and void and the customer accounts will be sent back to the utility.

Doug Austin, Executive Vice President of IGS Energy, said, "IGS Energy is pleased to serve residents of the city of Dayton. After just recently purchasing DPL Energy Resources from DP&L, this is just further testament to our commitment to offering the Dayton area business and residents an opportunity to save on their electricity costs. We are thrilled to be part of such an amazing community."

New customers to the program must be in good standing and cannot be part of the utility's Percentage of Income Payment Program (PIPP).
