



Commissioner Christopher Shaw to serve on National League of Cities Transportation and Infrastructure Services Committee

Dayton City Commissioner Christopher Shaw has been appointed to the National League of Cities (NLC) 2022 Transportation and Infrastructure Services federal advocacy committee.

Commissioner Shaw was elected to a one-year term and will provide strategic direction and guidance for NLC's federal advocacy agenda and policy priorities. The appointment was announced by the NLC President, Mayor Vince Williams of Union City, Georgia.

"I am thrilled to be joining NLC's Transportation and Infrastructure Services Committee during this exciting moment for our nation's infrastructure," said Shaw. "Investments in our roads and public transportation infrastructure are critical for Dayton's continued economic growth. As a committee member, I'm looking forward to advocating for cities to be able to put funds from the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act to use quickly to address communities' most pressing needs."

Shaw will play a key role among a diverse group of local leaders in shaping NLC policy positions and advocating on behalf of America's municipalities before Congress, with the Biden administration and at home. The committee's work includes policy development related to roads and bridges, transit, rail, aviation and ports as well as transportation technology.

"NLC's federal advocacy committees are a key tool for gathering insights directly from the communities that our members serve," said NLC President Williams. "I am excited to have Commissioner Shaw serve on the Transportation and Infrastructure Service Committee and look forward to working with him to fulfill the promise of America's cities, towns and villages."

The leadership of this year's committee consists of Chair Elaine Clegg (council president, Boise, ID); Vice Chair Dr. Barbara Odom-Wesley (council member, Arlington, TX); and Vice Chair Joseph Geierman (mayor, Doraville, GA).
