



Turn in prescription drugs on National Drug Take Back Day

On Saturday, April 30, from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., the Dayton Police Department will participate in the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) National Prescription Drug Take Back Day.

This event gives residents a chance to help prevent drug abuse, theft, and accidental poisonings by ridding homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription drugs. The majority of abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, often from the home medicine cabinet.



Bring the prescription drugs you want to dispose of to one of five drop-off sites around the city of Dayton. Drug drop-off is free and anonymous, no questions asked. Please note: Liquids, needles or sharps cannot be accepted; drop off pills only.

- Central Patrol Operations District - 248 Salem Ave.
- East Patrol Operations District North - 417 East Helena St.
- East Patrol Operations District South - 2721 Wayne Ave.
- West Patrol Operations District - 951 Washington St.
- Drive-through at Elizabeth Place: 1 Elizabeth Place (near the intersection of Albany and Cincinnati Streets, to the rear of Elizabeth Place).

If you cannot bring in your unused, unwanted, or expired prescription drugs on April 30, the police sites have drug drop-off boxes available for use year-round, Monday-Friday during business hours (8 a.m. to 4 p.m.).
