- 1.) Did you want a monthly rate to provide service with an hourly rate for any installation of outdated equipment?

The rates are for work covered in the \$25,000 allowance.

- 2.) You mention in the RFP that you have stock on hand that is to be used first before purchasing new equipment. Do you have an inventory list of that equipment?

Network cables, managed switches, and electrical items such as outlets are stocked. An inventory is not available. Electric strike, media converter, card reader, or CCTV items are not stocked.

- 3.) You have an annual allowance of \$25,000 to replace obsolete equipment at the end of its life. Is the replacement equipment you have in stock already part of that \$25,000 annual allowance or is that up-and-above the current stock?

The in-stock equipment is not part of the allowance.

- 4.) With the ever-changing cost of equipment, how often are we allowed to update the equipment price sheet that we are required to provide to you?

We would expect an explanation stating the reasons for the cost increase, why the new price is fair and reasonable, and documentation supporting the increase.

- 5.) For the security camera bid, are we to simply provide service or are we replacing equipment as well? Namely, the HikVision equipment that has been banned in the US as of November of last year.

We will replace the HikVision equipment as quickly as possible, depending on the funds available.
