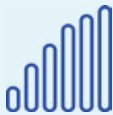

ENGLISH INSTRUCTION

Our English language instruction is rooted in best practices, delivered by a diverse team of TESOL professionals. The program guides students toward academic and cultural self-sufficiency as they learn, explore and practice the habits necessary for success in reaching their goals. Six levels of proficiency and short terms allow students to advance through the program at their own pace.

Our program partners with University academic departments and programs, as well as the local community, to create and facilitate opportunities for intercultural exchange and personal development.



SIX LEVELS OF PROFICIENCY

The IEP offers courses at six levels of proficiency from Pre-academic to Level 7: intermediate beginner to advanced. Courses progress from developing basic communication skills to developing the skills needed to study in an academic degree program delivered in English. Instruction includes development of practical skills such as critical thinking, communication, collaboration and creativity: 21st century skills.



7-WEEK TERMS

In our 7-week terms, students receive 18-21 hours of instruction per week addressing a complete range of language skills including reading and vocabulary development, writing and grammar, oral communication, and special topics.

SPECIAL PROGRAM FEATURES

IEP initial and ongoing orientation programs help students successfully acclimate to their new environment and prepare for success while enrolled in an intensive program.

In levels 4 through 6, **special topics courses** complement the core curriculum and provide opportunities to further explore language, community, culture and academic preparedness.

Course collaborations between University of Dayton academic courses and IEP courses bring students together. Students communicate and work together for a particular purpose in order to meet student learning outcomes for each course.

The **IEP Tutoring Lab** provides all IEP students the benefit of free personalized tutoring and language skills workshops, delivered by highly skilled and qualified professional instructors in our tutoring lab.

Co-curricular programming includes authentic lectures given by University of Dayton professors (both live and via video) in the IEP's upper-

level oral communication and listening/note-taking courses.

Extracurricular activities connect domestic and IEP students to share an experience together. Through this special programming, IEP students practice their language skills and have fun!

With more than 200 **student clubs and organizations** on campus, students will find an activity to match their interests and opportunities to meet American and international students. Clubs include professional and academic clubs, service organizations, recreational sports, special interest groups, and international student groups.

Students in the Intensive English Program are encouraged to be a part of the University of Dayton community by living on campus. The **Global Learning and Living Community (GLLC)** is a group of U.S. and international students living together and sharing culture and language through activities on and off campus.



WHERE CHALLENGE MEETS SUPPORT

The Intensive English Program provides exceptional student support services to ensure that all students in the IEP have the best experience possible while at University of Dayton.

ACADEMIC AND NON-ACADEMIC ADVISING

The IEP student advisor and support specialist assists students in achieving their academic and personal goals through one-on-one advisement meetings and group sessions.

IMMIGRATION ADVISING

The Office of International Student and Scholar Services (ISSS) provides all immigration needs for University of Dayton IEP students. ISSS also offers social and extracurricular activities and workshops for international students, including those in the IEP.

UNIVERSITY OF DAYTON LIBRARY

The library is a central part of life at the University of Dayton. Students have access to books, many individual or group study



rooms, computers and printers, and can find resources in print or online to meet their study needs. Librarians will answer any questions students may have by phone, chat (IM), email or text.

CAREER SERVICES

International students have the option to seek employment on campus through the University's job search network, an online service that connects students, alumni and employers.

OFFICE OF LEARNING RESOURCES (OLR)

The Office of Learning Resources (OLR) is a learning resource for students, parents, faculty and staff at the University of Dayton. Some of their offerings include disability services, academic tutoring, writing assistance/tutoring, and cultural activities and programming.

DAYTON, OHIO

is a hidden gem, rich in history, culture and recreation. A mid-sized city in southwestern Ohio, Dayton is filled with imagination, innovation, and world-class arts and culture.

As the “Birthplace of Aviation,” Dayton’s brightest and bravest have always pushed society forward, inventing the airplane, the cash register, the electric car starter, modern refrigeration and the bar code scanner, to name just a few. Dayton has been named as a top 20 city for STEM jobs, ranking ahead of Columbus, Ohio; Chicago; Los Angeles; and New York City.





Dayton is an affordable city— housing, food, transportation and entertainment cost considerably less in Dayton than in other U.S. cities. It is located two hours or less from Columbus, Ohio; Cincinnati, Ohio; Indianapolis, Indiana; and Louisville, Kentucky.



Dayton is a diverse community of many religions and cultures, and students are likely to find a local group that represents their home culture. The city offers a number of diverse places to worship and community centers. The annual World A'Fair and many other cultural celebrations, such as the Lebanese, German, Greek and Asian festivals, offer students opportunities to connect with the wider community.



A center of technology and industry, the city is a magnet for technological development and is home to corporations such as LexisNexis, Reynolds and Reynolds, Fuyao, and, located on University of Dayton's campus, the Helix Innovation Center by Copeland. It is also home to the U.S. Air Force's major research center at Wright-Patterson Air Force Base.

The University of Dayton IEP is designed to benefit both degree-seeking students and those who wish to have an English language and U.S. American culture immersion experience.

Students have two options when applying to the Intensive English Program at the University of Dayton:

EARN YOUR DEGREE

Students who plan to continue at the University of Dayton to matriculate at the undergraduate or graduate level should apply for admission to the undergraduate or graduate program.

Students who are academically qualified but need to improve their English may be conditionally admitted to the University. These students will study in the IEP until they are ready for their academic program. After successfully completing the IEP, conditionally admitted students will be fully admitted to the University, with no further need for language proficiency test scores (e.g., TOEFL, IELTS, PTE, etc.).

CULTURAL IMMERSION

Students who plan to only enroll in the Intensive English Program for language and cultural immersion, and do not plan to pursue an academic program, should apply for direct admission to the Intensive English Program.

For those interested in improving their English language skills and learning more about American culture only, the IEP provides many curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular programming designed specifically to meet these needs.

SCHOLARSHIPS

Scholarships are available for currently enrolled, self-supported IEP students (language immersion only or conditionally admitted) after the first term of study. Scholarships are awarded based on academic performance and participation in co-curricular and extracurricular activities and programming.

IEP CALENDAR

The IEP offers four 7-week terms of study per academic year. Full-time students receive 18-21 hours of instruction per week. Successful students are able to complete their English language studies in one year or less with no need for language proficiency testing for University of Dayton admission.
